Annexure - 3

Feedback Analysis Report (Students)

At the end of each year we have taken students feedback of all faculty members based on six points scale (6) = outstanding, (5) = Excellent, (4) = Very good, (3) = Good, (2) = Average and (1) = Below Average. Two kinds of tests are conducted (A) General / Attitude Related Test and (B) Subject Related Test. Each student is provided a separate evaluation sheet and is told to give his / her rating in the prescribed format. A detailed analysis of feedback is worked out with figures for improvement in teaching. The complete record of feedback analysis is kept updated in the college office.
